MATERIAL PALLETTE

Current proposals show the pavement and public space areas as a warm mixture of Granite slabs to complement and link two of Maybole's key buildings; the Town Hall and the Castle. A smaller, more reddish tone and smaller slab size will be used in the single-width carraigeway's to create a more intimate and market town feel.







































Natural Stone Paving Slabs e.g. granite in warm tones




